



Margaret M. Crotty is the president and CEO of John Snow, Inc. and JSI Research & Training Institute (JSI), global public health consulting firms dedicated to greater health equity and improving the health of individuals and communities. Margaret is also the president of World Education, a JSI affiliate, which works to improve the education and economic security of people around the world.

Most recently, Margaret served for ten years as CEO of Partnership with Children, a major provider of community health services and school-based mental health programs through a broad range of federal, state, and local contracts. Previously, she launched and led Save the Children's flagship \$2 billion initiative to reduce global maternal and child mortality and served as president and chief executive officer of AFS- USA Intercultural Programs. In the private sector, Margaret held several executive positions at EF Education, the world's largest privately held education company, in Shanghai, Hong Kong, and Paris. She has lived in Indonesia twice, working for McKinsey & Co. and Save the Children.

Margaret graduated from Princeton University with a BA in History and African-American Studies. She also holds an MBA from Harvard Business School and a Masters in Public Health from the Mailman School at Columbia University. Margaret also serves on the boards of Northwell Health, the CUNY School of Public Health, the United Hospital Fund, and ACCESS Health International. In June 2023, she was elected as the new chair of the Northwell Health Board of Trustees, the first woman to serve as in that role.
