



**Dr. Adelaide Barnes** is an Associate Professor of Clinical Pediatrics in the Division of General Pediatrics, Section of Hospital Medicine. She received her BA in Sociology from Duke University and her MD from The George Washington University School of Medicine and Health Sciences. Dr. Barnes completed residency training in Pediatrics at the Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia, where she also served as Chief Resident. She is board certified in General Pediatrics and Pediatric Hospital Medicine. Clinically, Dr. Barnes is an attending on the Pediatric Hospital Medicine service, is an expert in natural airway sedation, and serves as one of the Physician Supervisors for Patient Flow.

Dr. Barnes has served as an Associate Program Director within the CHOP Pediatric Residency Program since 2016, establishing and leading the Global Health Track, where she remains the Director. She served as the Director of Recruitment and Chair of the Intern Selection Committee for the Pediatric Residency Program from 2014-2025. She is passionate about equity and inclusion within academic pediatrics and sits on the multidisciplinary CHOP Inclusion and Belonging Council, the Committee on Belonging, Inclusion, and Equity within the Executive Committee of the Medical Staff and is an Advisor on Leadership Accountability Team for the Department of Pediatrics.

Nationally, Dr. Barnes is the Chair of the Global Health Learning Community for the Association of Pediatric Program Directors, where the goal is to optimize standards and develop innovative curricula for global health education within pediatric residency programs in the US. She also serves as a core faculty member on the Curriculum Advisory Committee for the Global Health Education in Equity, Antiracism, and Decolonization (GHEARD) curriculum through the American Academy of Pediatrics. Internationally, Dr. Barnes has extensive experience developing curricula and faculty development programs, and teaching in such places as the University of Botswana, the Open Medical Institute in Mexico City and Salzburg, and Vin University in Hanoi.

In recognition of her many accomplishments, she has received numerous awards, including the Dean’s Award for Excellence in Clinical Teaching, the Diversity and Inclusion Award for the Division of General Pediatrics, Section of Hospital Medicine, the Diversity Endowment Award through the Department of Pediatrics, and spent multiple years on the CHOP Early Faculty Honor Roll. In January 2025, she was appointed as the Medical Director of Global Pediatric Education for the Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia.

Since 2025, Dr. Barnes has served as a Medical Co-Director of the Open Medical Institute.
